

DR. JAMES J. YARMUS OF NEW CITY EARNS 'FELLOW' DESIGNATION

Dr. James J. Yarmus, PE of New City, president of the New York State Society of Professional Engineers (NYSSPE), has been named a Fellow member of the National Society of Professional Engineers (NSPE). The NSPE leadership established the Fellow member grade in 2000 to honor those active members who have demonstrated exemplary service to their profession, their society and their community. In accordance with national policy, Yarmus will receive his Fellow member certificate and pin from the NSPE's immediate past president at the NYSSPE annual convention at Saratoga Springs in June.

Yarmus, 68, was installed as the NYSSPE's first Latino president during the organization's annual convention last June. He is an engineer, urban and trans-

portation planner and construction manager who runs a consulting service in New City. Yarmus was born in Cuba and immigrated to the U.S. in 1960. He has been based in Rockland County since 1972 and has more than 30 years of experience as a licensed professional engineer. He has also been an affiliate professor of engineering and project management since the 1990s.
